Stu, the pillows have me! They won't let go. Just leave me here, I am a lost cause, but you still have a chance.

ACT ONE

STU

TOM

Is the look of despair or the look of unwillingness to be awake at this ungodly hour?

BARISTA

STU

Right... I will take a large non-fat latte with a carmel drizzle.

BARISTA

Yes sir, excellent choice!

Tom rips his sunglasses off his face and places them on the counter.

STU

ACT TWO

LIZ

(whispering)

STU

(whispering)

Tom was being a little bitch to wake up this morning.

TOM

Liz, you're the real hero!

LIZ

What?

STU

Don't mind him. Some lady at the coffee shop called us heroes because we are teachers.

LIZ

You're a PE teacher. That doesn't count.

STU

Seriously?! How does that not count?

MRS. STUDEBAKER, the new principal, clears her throat and begins to talk louder over Stu and Liz.

MRS. STUDEBAKER

As I was saying, this is my first year as a principal. I have three years of experience as a guidance counselor at Peewinkle Preparatory Academy ---

CONTINUED:

STU
(whispering)
Oh jesus. A guidance counselor
turned principal.

Stu sarcastically smirks at Jeff, the current school counselor at Rising Pines Elementary School, who is mesmerized by Mrs. Studebaker.

TOM
(whispering)

JEFF

That's not true!

TOM

Seriously, you are one to talk
traitor. When was the last time you
had to implement a change that
makes no sense and doesn't work?

JEFF

Uhhhh...

STU

Exactly. I am pretty sure you
haven't been in a classroom
teaching since the transition of
literature from stones to paper.

The group laughs at Jeff's expense.

NESS

Well, what's the big deal? They are
here to help to help us get an A.
Isn't that what we are all trying
to do?

(CONTINUED)

CONTINUED:

TOM

Speak for yourself, I am just trying to make it to Christmas break.

LIZ

I think PSI is just a way to micromanage us.

JEFF

Hey, let's give this a shot.

NESS

NESS (CONT'D)
